Happy 4th of July!!

The Thirteen British Colonies (or Thirteen American Colonies) that declared Independence from the British Monarch in 1776, as enacted on July 4 of that year, made this declaration because they felt they were ready for independence. However, this declaration was also a declaration of inter-dependence between each other AND a wider inter-dependence with the rest of the world.

History has shown the above intent, and the United States grew to be one of the most powerful nations in the world. Our independence, unless understood to be an inter-dependence with the wider community, is a declaration of isolation that turns in on itself. Once we as a nation, as a church or as individuals forget that principle, we are on a fast track to losing our power and sense of worth.

At UELC, we have learnt the value of interdependence, and so we have become a vibrant, connected church. As we celebrate Independence Day this year, let us remember the spirit of interdependence as our Scriptures insist we live into. Hear the words of the writer to the Hebrews:

"²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." Heb. 10:24-25 (ESV)

Council met on June 4th, 2019

The roofing project is nearing completion with a few uncompleted items which are in the process of completion. A request has been to Cantley to provide a completion date.

The copier will soon be replaced since the present one cannot be repaired.

The sanctuary cushions and kneelers need replacement. Vibeke presented samples of printed fabrics that can be purchased locally. It was recommended that the kneelers be 5 inches thick to ensure greater comfort. It was suggested that the Memorial fund be a source of funds for this project. Quotes and samples of suitable fabrics will be obtained.

The Financials were reviewed. Pastor shared a comparison of a 4 month period from 2016 through 2019 of giving patterns. The total seems to be less than previous years. Some may have shifted from regular giving to the Roofing campaign.

FAT will soon commence planning for the 2019 Stewardship campaign.


Altar Flowers

Florida Bahamas Synod Assembly

Report on Florida Bahamas Synod Assembly held June 6-8, 2019 in Kissimmee, Florida

"Alive in Christ" was the theme of this year's conference. This year's assembly was voting for synod council positions, other committee positions and considering the budget for the next year. There were many reports submitted including the Bishop's, the Vice-President's the Treasurers report as well as reports regarding WELCA, Youth, the damage and recovery from Hurricane Michael and Churchwide report from ELCA head office in Chicago. These reports can be viewed on the Florida Bahama's website at fbsynod.com, go to the Synod Assembly and look at the Assembly Guidebook.

The service project this year was the Community of Hope Center in Osceola County. It is described as a homeless outreach and self-sufficiency center. They provide services to all those in need both individuals and families.

Special highlights include:

An inter-religious dialogue that included an Arab-America Muslim Imam, an African-American Muslim cleric and a Rabbi. This was followed by a showing of a brief film entitled "Father K" about Pastor Khader El-Yateem's experiences as a pastor and then candidate for public office in New York, where he brought together Jewish and Palestinian Americans. Pastor El-Yateem accepted a call to the Florida Bahama's synod where he now serves as Assistant to the Bishop and Director for Evangelical Mission (DEM) for South Florida.

A presentation entitled "Vitality" helped the assembly get an idea of the plans the Bishop and his staff have for our synod this year focusing on growing the leadership including rostered and lay leadership. Pastor Rob
