A Word from Bishop Suarez about Preparing for Hurricane Dorian

August 30, 2019

Dear Friends.

Current projections predict Hurricane Dorian will make landfall in Florida sometime Monday or Tuesday. In an abundance of precaution, the synod office will be closed on Tuesday, although the staff are able to work from home and will stay connected and in good communication with each other throughout the weekend. Please continue to monitor local safety instructions and do what you need to do to stay safe and to help those around you stay safe.

Michele Hilton has been working hard to put the pieces of our synod's disaster response plan into place. She is in good communication with local and national disaster response partners, as well as with ELCA leadership in Chicago. We are grateful for that care. We will continue to share relevant information via email, on the synod web site, and on our synod facebook page as it is available. Conference Deans, disaster chaplain Pr. 


