#### Our Mission


**UELC's Mission:**

surprise that the 9 months of expectation culminated in the birth of a baby? No, it was not a surprise. When one anticipates something it is not a surprise. One simply prepares for it

In the entire Gospel narrative, there is anticipation. As we begin Advent, a time of expectant



waiting, we commemorate, maybe even re-live, the expectant waiting of the world, let alone the expectant waiting of Mary and Joseph. Matthew's gospel graphically describes that first Advent. In fact, Matthew takes us way back to Abraham as he painfully lists the genealogy - 42 generations! (Most of us don't know the sequence, because we skip over that section - me too). Then Matthew explains the anticipation and details the birth narrative.

Anticipation is not just in the birth narrative. The Gospel writers remind their audiences that the prediction of the messiah's coming goes back centuries - a long, long time ago. When Jesus Christ walked the earth, he too has the world anticipating the unfolding of the Gospel story further. Remember His narrative of the betrayal, the denial, the capture, the crucifixion, the resurrection, the ascension and even His second coming. The whole gospel story is an Advent story.

Anticipation does not bring surprises but does spur us on to live as people prepared – not just for Christmas but for Life! As we prepare for Christmas this Advent, let's also be reminded that our whole life as Christians is one of joyful anticipation. Anticipating the final fulfilment of the promise of Eternal Life for those "who believe in Him" (John 3:16) – a belief that Jesus is the Christ - the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6).
