## Black Is Beautiful - lament, repent and celebrate!

In the 1960s a movement with the name and slogan, "Black is Beautiful" rose into the spotlight. In a world decrying blackness with "white is right" and "black get back", it became necessary to affirm blackness. This movement did not seek to put down people classified as white but to liberate those classified as black and anyone not considered white.

"...Full many a flower is born to blush unseen And waste its sweetness on the desert air..." Thomas Gray, Elegy Written in a County Churchyard

February in the US is a month when we celebrate and commemorate the often unacknowledged contributions of Black people in the history of the United States of America and of the world. These are the unsung heroes and sheroes, the "flower(s) born to blush unseen" as the harsh order of modern society "waste(s) (their) sweetness", relegated to the "desert air". In the US, we have, therefore, declared February "Black History Month". Our world celebrates the role of people of African Descent in world history, and laments the omissions as the story of humankind is rewritten.

### **Council President's Report**

The UELC Church Council met on January 21, 2020.

Jim Yale, treasurer presented the 2020 spending plan. The council discussed budgeting for facility improvements including the bathrooms in the sanctuary building, as well as a provision to cover potential merit pay increases for the staff in 2020. The council discussed the need for reactivation of the Mutual

Ministry board in this regard. The final spending plan will be presented to the congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting on February 9, 2020.

The Financial Action Team (FAT) report, presented by Jackie Klein, noted several items discussed at their meeting and the council recommended exploring a different version of QuickBook ® software to potentially resolve errors in payroll deductions that have occurred by the currently contracted company. Pastor Jacob noted there have been several visitors to UELC over the past few months, many of whom reside in Gainesville. Pastor suggested the need for a subcommittee of the "Inviting Team" to follow up with visitors.

Bishop Pedro Suarez will be hosted by UELC on Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup> as part of his visit to the Pinelands Conference, of which Pastor Jacob is Dean. The Bishop will lead a worship service, and also address questions about the synod. UELC will prepare to host the Bishop and Pinelands Conference members with breakfast that day. ## In Memory of Alvin Schilling

UELC member since 1998, Alvin Schilling, passed away in Jacksonville Memorial Hospital on January 6, 2020, Pastor Jacob at his side.

Alvin (Al) was born on April 8, 1949, in Newberry, Michigan, to William and Myrtle Schilling. Following his graduation from George Mason University International School of Law, he built a successful law practice in northern Virginia. Later, after moving to Florida, he continued his work as an attorney, obtained a Masters' degree in history, and a PhD in History and Educational Law. Al is survived by siblings William Schilling, Lois (John) Winslow, Fred (Marcia) Schilling, and Timothy (Judy) Schilling; seven nieces and nephews; seven cousins and many great nieces and nephews. Brother Paul Schilling preceded him in death. A memorial service will be held at a future date in Michigan. His family asks that memorial gifts be made to the Organ Fund at University Evangelical Lutheran Church.



While AI was an active member at UELC, he served on the Congregational Council, the Worship Committee and headed the Worship Board. He helped with a number of fundraisers, and frequently led the Adult Forum sessions. He was a gourmet cook and brought exceptional contributions to our monthly



LIFT potluck luncheons and to church dinners. Shari, who knew Al for twenty years, tells how he had supported her ministry to the Jacksonville Campus Ministry program in many different ways. She also recalls Al teasing her about going motorcycle cruising with him, which she declined. Otto expands our knowledge of Al's contributions on the University of Florida campus. When Otto was President of the Florida Foreign Language Association, he called upon Al to give a key note address on legal issues in the educational establishment. This aroused such interest and prompted so many questions, Otto invited Al to offer workshops on the subject in subsequent meetings.

Al's early hearing loss complicated his professional life, and he was in poor health the last several years. Following surgery for cancer at North Florida Hospital in 2018, he was admitted to Plaza Health and Rehab in Gainesville, and later transferred to First Coast Health and Rehab in Jacksonville. A number of UELC members who knew him wrote thoughts and tributes to Al in a memory book, which was sent to his sister Lois in Michigan.



#### Lazarus Project Sponsorships
